Block of the Month

Attached to this Newsletter are Block of the Month materials from Chris.

Welcome to the 2012 Thimbles and Friends Block of the Month Program. Each month we will present a new block aimed at informing the beginning quilter, challenging the intermediate quilter, and inspiring the advanced quilter. We will demo each block at the monthly guild meeting as well as publish each block in the monthly newsletter.

You may use any fabrics of your choice for each block-themed, repro, contemporary, Kaffe or batik. This is a great
opportunity to "blast your stash." There will be a total of nine
blocks (each will finish at 12") and in the last month we will
offer some setting options with yardages. We hope you will
be able to present your unique creations at next year's quilt
show. Each month you will receive:

- An assembly diagram to help you plan your block.
- A fabric chart to plan your fabric placement and cutting.
- Specific directions for assembly.

We have provided you with a "Helpful Hints" article (attached) that describes specific piecing techniques for these blocks. Please review these before sewing and keep them close at hand for reference. We will welcome any of your questions by e-mail or at the guild meeting.

<u>Pork Chops with Tomato Sauce</u> <u>and Mushrooms - Crock Pot</u>

Ingredients

2 lb. boneless pork loin chops 8 oz. fresh mushrooms, sliced 1 medium onion, chopped 2-3 cloves garlic, chopped 2 (8 oz.) can tomato sauce 2 TBSP balsamic vinegar 2 TBSP minced fresh parsley 1/4 tsp. dried oregano 1/2 tsp. dried basil salt and pepper to taste 2 TBSP cornstarch 1/4 C cold water

Directions

- 1. Line crock pot/slow cooker or spray with cooking spray.
- 2. In a large skillet, brown pork chops on both sides.
- 3. Place half the chops in slow cooker.
- 4. Add mushrooms, onion, and garlic
- 5. Add remaining chops.
- 6. In bowl, combine tomato sauce, vinegar and spices. Pour over chops.
- 7. Cover and cook on LOW for 7-8 hours or until chops are done
- 8. Transfer chops to a plate; keep warm.
- 9. Transfer remaining sauce to a sauce pan. Stir cornstarch into water until smooth. Stir into sauce. Cook and stir until thickened. Serve with chops.

Minutes to Prepare: 20 Minutes to Cook: 420 Number of Servings: 8 addition to those volunteered.
