


Quilting is a popular subject and the books will be a useful addition to the library's collection.


about those special projects you want to undertake to submit to the show!

One of the best parts of the show & tell items in a display area. This way the members can take a closer look at the end of the meeting and use that opportunity to ask the quilt maker questions about technique, etc.

### Tips for Quilters

HOW MUCH FABRIC SHOULD I BUY?

General rule of thumb: If it's a fabric you love and feel could be a main print or border of a bed guilt, buy 3-4 Yards. This will give you enough in length for borders of a gueen or king sized guilt and some extra across the width for piecing or applique. If you think it will make a perfect secondary print or a blender fabric, buy 1-2 yards. If it would be a great accent, buy 1/2-1 yard. If you're doing paper piecing, fat quarters work great. OR buy as much as you can afford!!

Rte 3 South to Exit 13 Hanover/Rte 53-bear right off the exit ramp. You will pass


the Hanover Mall, follow this road (rte 53) for approximately 4 miles (stay on the right), you will see a Shaw's on your right. At the second set of lights AFTER SHAWS

(Citizen's Bank will be on your right). Take a right onto Broadway.

\*Follow Broadway (bearing right at the fork) for approximately 1 mile. Karen

Road is the second left-we are the fifth house on the right (gray/taupe, white shutters, set back).

If coming via Rte 139, follow Rte 139 to Rte 53. Take a right onto 53, at the set of lights at Broadway, take a right and follow the directions from \* above.
