National Quilt Collection



The National Quilt Collection, housed at the Smithsonian National Museum of American History began in the 1890s. The collection includes more than 500 quilts and quilt-related items, mainly of American origin, with examples from many states, including Alaska and Hawaii. The collection illustrates needlework techniques, materials, fabric designs and processes, styles and patterns used for quilt-making in the past 250 years and also documents the work of specific quilt-makers and commemorates events in American history.²

Esther Wheat's quilt

This quilt is part of the collection-Esther Wheat made this quilted indigo-blue wool bed cover for her dowry chest in the 1790s. Esther, a twin, was born in 1774 in Conway, Massachusetts.


Merrimack Valley Quilt Guild
