
Retreat Fun

Update on the Shop Hop

At the January meeting the guild unanimously voted to participate in the April 2016 Schoolhouse Shop Hop. Our April 2, 2016 meeting will be a bus trip to the 5 guilt shops involved. The generating costs for this trip are estimated at \$48.00 per participant, including the cost of renting a bus at \$1000.00 and paying the \$8.00 entry fee for each participant. Of note, Tracey does not have a confirmed cost for the bus yet that will include a discount. The guild voted for the \$48.00 cost to be divided with T & F participating members paying \$24.00 dollars and the guild paying the remaining cost of \$24.00. The \$8.00 registration fee has been paid, assuring us tote bags that will be picked up at our first quilt shop stop.

Many T&F members paid the \$24.00 fee at the January meeting. For members who are interested in attending and have not paid, Cathy Hodges is collecting this fee.

The guild voted to open any remaining bus seats to non-Thimble and Friend members at a cost of \$48.00. We anticipate there may only be 6 open seats based on the sign-up list from the January meeting.
