Greetings from Hanson


Good Morning Ladies,

FreeCycle Table

The Freecycle Table continues to be a huge success! Every month the volume of items that are dropped off on the table equals the volume of items that members take home. Last month someone said they had a big bag of scraps they did not want but thought them unworthy of the Freecycle Table. To that I say, everything is good and worthy of the Freecycle Table!!!! We have members who love working with scraps, even small ones. Please do not throw anything away, but instead bring it to the table. Even very old, ugly, scratchy and stiff fabric can be used for something, such as foundation piecing. I am currently involved in a project that requires small, even very small, scraps and narrow strips of batik fabrics, so bring them in!

On a side note, I was wondering if anyone would be interested in some more charity quilt precut packages like the ones we offered a while ago? A generous member of our guild took some coordinating fabrics from the Freecycle Table, cut them into squares or strips, and packaged them in a plastic bag or bunch for distribution to our members to get them started on a charity quilt. Quilt Show 2017

As you already know, our April 1 Guild Meeting will be devoted to 2017 Quilt Show catch-up and continued planning. We are beginning to think about the "details" of the show, like floor plans, organizing our "workforce", and bringing in the information from chairs whose activities can only be planned closer to the show dates. This is an important meeting for planning and information. Please try to attend.

Our agenda on April 1 will include:

- 1. A recap of activity to date,
- 2. Reports from quilt show sub-committee chairs,
- 3. Member participation expectations, and
- 4. The beginning of sign-ups for activities central for show staging.
 - May Lai will be prepared to address and begin sign up for Set Up day, White Glove, and Take Down.

I am requesting that all sub-chairs be prepared to report on:

- 1. What has been done to date in their area of responsibility
- 2. What is remaining to be done and with whom they may need to coordinate

One of our goals has been to staff the show during open hours in a manner that is efficient and orderly while honoring scheduling needs of the membership. Sub-chairs should be thinking about logistical and workforce requirements during the show and be prepared to detail those needs by the May Tea. The plan is to develop a "master list" of activities and the personnel required to carry out those activities. Examples of forms successfully used to organize activities in the past are available from the Quilt Show Chair.
