

Tips and Tricks

- Use the machine foot with the single hole for more precise piecing, along with machine quilting – Tracy P.
- I like to first stitch in the ditch along the structural lines of a quilt so that I can remove all safety pins when doing free motion quilting. And another thing I just tried on a small quilt--I didn't close the safety pins! Saved two steps and my fingers! – Jeanne A.
- Inspired to do some spring cleaning and reorganization in my sewing room, I searched "Quilt Studio Organization" and found an inexpensive, space saving way to store all my quilting rulers. I purchased peg board, spraypainted it white, and attached it to the inside of my sewing room door. At Lowe's, I found all the peg board accessories and even some wire baskets specifically for peg boards! Any directions that accompany a specialty ruler can be binder clipped and hung with the ruler. Now I have my rulers, scissors, and rotary cutters, all in one place! - Joyce H.

Here is a list of ideas to make this event an extra special one.


- Bring some non-perishable snacks, but each shop will have food and snacks also.


