

As a reminder, all charity quilts should have a label indicating they are from *Thimbles and Friends Quilt Guild, Abington, MA*.

The current show is called *Quilts Japan: The 13th Quilt Nihon Exhibition from Tokyo*. This exhibition of 36 award winning quilts premiered at the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum before traveling internationally. The NEQM is the only stop in the Northeast. It features some of the most original and extraordinary works from the largest international quilt contest in Japan and one of the most prestigious in the world. You will marvel at the complexity and beauty of these masterworks. This exhibition runs through April 21st. The NEQM is also featuring *The Hand Quilted Works of Gladi Porsche* through April 29th.
