For guild year 2015-2016, we received an amazing total of 78 charity items (quilts, sweaters, afghans, hats and mittens) which were donated to the South Shore Hospital, Homecare and Hospice Division. This organization serves 1500 patients in the South Shore area. Thanks to everyone who contributed and to our charity quilt co-ordinator Joyce Hochstrasser, and her mom Joanne Fruzzetti and sister Shirley MacLeod who assisted with the delivery of these items. 2016 Schoolhouse Shop Hop

The bus filled with our intrepid band of quilters left Rockland promptly at 8:00am. Goodie bags were handed out with our itinerary, a nail file, a packet of Cotton+Steel fabric, along with an assortment of patterns for 5" squares, these donated by Ann's Fabrics in Canton. And of course, chocolate! We were also given labels with our name and phone number preprinted to speed up registration at each shop. Janice and Tracey thought of everything!

We arrived right on schedule at the Red Barn Sewing & Yarn Center in Merrimac, MA. It was all very organized. The shop owner met us on the bus with books already stamped, and we collected our Shop Hop totes, stuffed with a fat quarter and two patterns. The Hugs and Kisses pattern, which each shop made and displayed in their own fabric choices, and a quick cuddle scarf pattern, including tips on how to work with cuddle fabric. There was also a demo with cuddle fabrics. The shop had a wide variety of beautiful fabrics and a lot of batiks!

Next we were off to Quilted Threads in Henniker, NH. We were welcomed on the bus, Check in was upstairs. The pattern given out was Mix & Match Stars. There was a brief demo of a stylus tool. Tables were set up to relax. Great soup! Many finished quilts were displayed with kits and patterns available. Lots and lots (and lots!) of beautiful fabrics, nicely displayed. Also a great selection of books, 25% off. (Did anyone leave without a bag?) A large shop, so much to see. Highly recommended!

Over the river and through the woods to our next stop in Lyndeborough, NH. (Queue the banjo's!) We arrived at the Bunkhouse Quilt shop and found ourselves in competition with another bus, already there! This was a rustic shop featuring traditional fabric designs. There was a demo for the Kite Ruler and Magic Mirror. Another pattern and fat quarter for the bag. There was an area to sit and take a break and meatball subs. Fortunately we were able to leave in the opposite direction, avoiding the narrow windy roads, and were back on the highway in no time.

Cobblestone Quilts in Townsend, MA was our next stop, with a friendly staff, well organized. There was an interesting Dresden plate templet demo with plenty of completed samples. Lots of fat quarters and coordinating fabric bundles. The shop featured a large collection of 30's fabrics. Bean soup with pasta. A lot packed into a little shop!

Our final stop was the Quilted Crow in Bolton, MA. We all registered for the Grand Prize and received a small Olfa rotary cutting mat and a coupon for 20% off a future shopping spree for completing the Shop Hop. There was a clever demo of the Stripy ruler. Delicious corn chowder (and brownies!) Lots of books and patterns. A big shop, lots of beautiful fabric collections, including wools.

There was something for everyone on this trip. We left with slightly thinner wallets, but with plenty of new fabric, notions, patterns, books and ideas. We shopped until we dropped, and a good time was had by all! Thanks to Janice O'Gara and Tracey Phillips for all of their work coordinating this trip!

Wavy Line Quilting


For those of us who run in fear at the words "machine quilting", I stumbled across this blog by Janice Ryan which might help.

Starting with a single wavy line, Janice's tutorial is based on echo quilting and filling in negative spaces. I referred to the guides

she drew on paper and was quite pleased with my results (below).



Janice suggested using the walking foot, however my Designer 1 was able to sense the quilting layer thickness allowing me to experiment with several of my other feet until I found one that worked best for me.
