Charity Quilts

Another guild year is beginning and it is time to consider what you would like to donate to our annual charity. South Shore Hospital Hospice and Homecare Division. This charity provides services to 1500 people at any one time on the South Shore, from newborn babies to elders. South Shore Hospice and Homecare will gladly accept and appreciate any size quilt that we wish to make and donate to their patients at any time during the year. We love this charity not only for the work that they do but also because it is open ended for us as members, no size restrictions and no deadlines. Quilts are accepted at the guild meetings from September to May for batch delivery to our charity's office located in Rockland. For the 2014-2015 guild year, 31 members donated a total of 106 items (quilts, crocheted/knitted blankets, baby sweaters, and hats) thanks to all of you!

Need help making a quilt? As the Charity Quilt team, we are here to help you! We encourage you to speak to us if you need help or if you want to buddy with someone to complete your charity quilt. Batting is provided by the guild, so please email, call or tell us the size that you need. Just a reminder, always put a label on the back of the quilt that says "Donated by Thimbles and Friends Quilt Guild".

Also, we want to have a few quilts for charity display at the quilt show, so any quilts collected at the September and October guild meetings may be used for the charity display.


