Your Quilt Show Committee has been meeting monthly since May and we've made some significant decisions guided by our vision to conduct one of the best quilt shows in the area and by our stated goals:

Increase guild membership participation


Streamline show processes e.g. set-up, take-down, record keeping, website information

Increase the guild's profile in the community

As chair I will be contributing to the newsletter monthly and reporting at guild meetings so membership is kept informed about the developments and so the committee can receive your input, comments, and suggestions. Although we will not be meeting as a total guild until October, I want to inform you of our progress to date. Please remember that Quilt Show Committee meetings are open to the entire guild membership. Your voice and ideas cannot be recorded unless you attend. Our meetings are scheduled for the 3rd Thursday of each month at 6:30pm at 392 South Street, Halifax, MA.

The Abington Senior Center will be the site for Quilt Show 2017. The committee investigated several sites and weighed pros and cons re: available space and its suitability for our multiple purposes, centrality of location, cost, and support services. The ASC will give the site to us in return for financial and/or in kind donations to the food pantry. As a guild we will make a financial donation to the Center which will be determined by the Board. Admission to the show will be \$7.00 with \$2 going to the food pantry. Guild members individually may make a financial or in kind donation. As you can see this arrangement is a win-win for both organizations.

While the financials are favorable, the layout is even more



October Workshop

The October programming will be Shirley MacLeod and Gina Stone conducting an informative. interesting and hands on workshop on "Sew Many Scraps, What To Do." All you need to bring is your listening caps, some scraps (a little or a lot), a cutting board and rotary cutter. We will cover how to organize scraps, what to put them in, the most useful and efficient ways to cut them up and will show examples of the aforementioned. We will also show clever and beautiful quilts we have made with scraps to get you inspired. We will get you started on everything you need to know to organize those scrappy scraps and use them all up.

Charity Quilts

For the 2015-2016 guild year we took in a total of 100 handmade quilts, afghans, knitted blankets, mittens and hats for donation to the Homecare and Hospice Division of South Shore Hospital! This is an amazing amount of donations given the size of our guild! Our charity representative is always so grateful to receive our handmade items

so. For those of you unacquainted with the Center it is bright, airy, and clean, centrally located, and has ample parking. It offers two very large rooms for vendors and quilt display, a large kitchen, a break room for quilt show staff, a locked room for storing staff personal items, large restrooms with multiple stalls, and the services of a janitor. This means we will be able to increase the number of vendors and our membership will have the opportunity to display at least two to three of their gorgeous quilts.

The bigger venue with the potential of higher attendance means there will be many opportunities for guild members to participate in a variety of ways during the show. There has been a great deal of discussion around how we can enable guild members to participate during the show in a way that honors their life obligations and schedules. Our discussions have led to the idea that each member plan to spend 6 hours over the time of the show (Friday through Sunday) at the show. They may serve all six hours at once or in minimum two hour segments. They may vary the activities in which they participate. Each member will receive an entry ticket for each 2 hours served that will be placed into a raffle for a fabric gift. Of course, the more hours you work the more raffle tickets you earn. Each member will be responsible for finding another member to cover any shift they are unable to fulfill.

The committee has selected 3 quilt show themes as finalists for membership consideration. They are:

Quilts Color Our World

A Festival of Color

Celebrations!

We will select the theme at the October guild meeting.

Lastly, we have several committee chair positions open. Most urgently we need volunteers for the solicitation of Show Book ads and the selling of Quilt Raffle Tickets. These are central to the financial success of the show. Of course a group of members could volunteer for these activities; it does not have to be one person. Duties spread amongst a group can make a substantial responsibility much more manageable. I plan to distribute a complete list of available positions and of filled positions at the October meeting.

As many of you know a SEW DAY will be held at the Abington Library on September 17 for those not traveling to Pat Delaney's exhibit in Bennington, Vermont. During that Sew Day Linda Robbins will coordinate the assembly of the Quilt Show '17 raffle quilt. Those wishing to volunteer for this activity will be welcomed generously.


