Hope you are ready to welcome fall and our October 1 meeting! I am looking forward to getting some more ideas about what to do with scraps at the meeting. I have a pile of them to bring.

The Thimbles and Friends Board had a meeting at my home on August 25. Following are the main decisions we made.

We dealt with the issue of scheduling meeting agendas. Both this year and next had only one "TBD"-- the November meeting in each case. A few days after the board meeting we settled on the event for 2016 -- a slide show on Bali and its fabric to be given by Chris Thierfelder's friend. We still have an opening for November 2017, so if you would like to participate in giving one of the workshops we ranked highly, let me or a board member know.

We evaluated how well the meetings went last year and decided we need another sharing vehicle for each meeting this year. We settled upon "Favorites" -- having members talk about their favorite quilting tool, pattern, book, website or blog. That will start on October 1st! It's a great way of participating at meetings. Volunteers each month can expand our appreciation of quilting!

As a matter of expediency, we decided that the guild treasurer henceforth can approve expenditures \$50 and under, only requiring a board member signature for expenditures over that amount.

Lastly, we discussed whether the guild should continue to subsidize meals at the quilt retreat and bus trips for the shop hop. We want to, but decided it would be prudent to put off such decisions until we see the state of our treasury closer to the times of expenditure.

Celebrations!


We want to hear everyone's show theme choice, so if you are unable to attend the October meeting please email either myself or Linda Robbins with your selection to be included in the total vote tally.
