

#### **Quilt Show Update**

We are getting closer to our quilt show! We can't believe it is less than a month away.

We hope everyone is working on boutique items, selling raffle tickets, making friendship squares and pulling fabric from your stash to bag and sell.

Quilt show set up and quilt drop off will be Friday October 18th between noon and 5pm at the Church. We need all available help. Remember this is your show. It helps defray the costs of our retreat and expenses throughout the year.

Please make sure all quilts are marked with name attached to each quilt.

Each quilt should be in a STURDY BAG, each bag clearly marked with your name and the name of the quilt.

If you can't make the Friday drop off, make arrangements with someone. Quilts will **not** be accepted on Saturday.

Quilt pick up will not take place until the close of the show after they have been returned to their bags.

Signup sheets for show duties will be at our October meeting.

Remember this is our quilt show; everyone is expected to be there on the day of the show unless you are out of town.

#### Retreat 2020

Good Quilters – It is already time to dream about Retreat 2020! In addition, we also need to make some decisions as a group. The retreat is February 6, 7, 8 and 9, 2020 at the Hotel 1620 at 180 Water Street in Plymouth. Retreaters may attend some or all the days. You can stay overnight or choose to commute. Each attendee staying over or commuting will be required to pay between \$75-\$85. This price depends on the number of attendees and our choice of the meal options. We will vote as a group at the October meeting for the choice of meals. This price covers the cost of two communal meals (lunch buffet on Saturday and Sunday brunch) and the cost to rent the food room, sewing room and administration costs. I was able to secure the same rate for the sleeping rooms (\$125.10 including taxes share!) This rate has not changed since 2015. People outside the membership of Thimbles and Friends are welcome to attend – up to the cap of 35 people. A non-refundable deposit of \$50.00 will be collected in December, **Note: this is non-refundable**. If you find another person to attend in your place, you can get you deposit from them.

Hotel 1620 offers 24-hour front desk, complimentary WIFI, pool, fitness center, restaurant serving breakfast and dinner each day (no lunch) and refrigerators in each room. Keurig coffee makers and hair dryers are in each room. Hotel 1620 is within easy walking distance to shopping and restaurants.
